Specific Area

Literacy

The children will participate in daily RWI synthetic phonics sessions (beginning in October after children settle in). The children will learn to say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and 10 digraphs. They will learn to read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by blending.

The children will develop their comprehension and love of reading by listening to a range of high-quality fiction and non-fiction texts. They will gain an understanding of key characters, story settings and key events. They will learn to anticipate key events in stories.
